CISCO Collaboration focuses on adding phones and users in an environment that is similar to what students will see in an enterprise system and prepares students to write the first of the CCNA Collaboration certification exams. Students will work in an environment that includes Cisco Unified Communications Manager (CUCM) Unity Connection and client devices.

The Course Development Consultant is responsible for the development of course materials in the CISCO Collaboration course, which support learning outcomes, align with current industry expectations and requirements, and follow instructional best-practices.

Responsibilities include but are not limited to:

- Act as a subject matter expert to ensure course content is reflective of contemporary practices in the industry.
- Attend development meetings as required.
- Communicate effectively with development team to ensure time lines are met.
- Verify and further develop (where necessary) the proposed course learning outcomes.
- Validate and/or identify texts and other reading and reference materials.
- Complete deliverables including course outline, lesson plans, presentation materials, and assessment materials.
