- Attend development meetings as required.
- Communicate effectively with development team to ensure time lines are met.
- Verify and further develop (where necessary) the proposed course learning outcomes.
- Validate and/or identify texts and other reading and reference materials.
- Complete deliverables including course outline, lesson plans or facilitation guides, presentation materials, and assessment materials.
