



## MATURE STUDENT ADMISSION CATEGORY

Applicants who do not qualify for regular admission may be eligible to apply as a mature student. All post-secondary certificate and diploma programs at MITT will consider applicants for mature student admission.

Applicants who do not meet the regular admission requirements will be automatically considered for mature student admission if they meet all of the following conditions:

- Do not have the academic qualifications for regular admission
- Are a Canadian citizen or permanent resident of Canada
- Will be at least 19 years of age by the start date of their chosen program
- Have been away from high school for a minimum of 1 year at the time of application
- Are applying to a post-secondary certificate or diploma program (*Applicants applying to post-graduate programs must meet the general entrance requirements of the program they are applying to and will not be considered for mature student admission*)
- Do not have a formal basis of admission (i.e. have not graduated high school or have not graduated with a recognized high school credential)
- Are in good academic standing (i.e. not on academic probation, suspension, etc.) with all previous post-secondary institutions (*Applicable to applicants with previous post-secondary studies*)

Mature student applicants who have previously attended an accredited University or College for a year or more (i.e. 24 credit hours or more) must also meet the following condition:

- Must have achieved at least a “C” (60%) average in ALL academic work attempted to be eligible for admission as a mature student.

Mature student applicants must still meet all program-specific prerequisite course and grade requirements as well as any additional admission requirements such as English Language proficiency.

Skills assessments in Math and English are available for select programs. If eligible, applicants will be offered skills assessments once an application has been submitted. *Skills assessments are only available to individuals who have submitted an application to MITT.*

### How to Apply

To be considered for mature student admission, applicants must first apply for regular admission following the normal admission process and provide all required documentation (high school and post-secondary transcripts (if applicable), proof of English Language Proficiency, etc.). If an applicant is determined to be a suitable candidate for mature student admission, we will ask for submission of the following supporting documents:

- Proof of age (driver’s license, passport or birth certificate)
- Proof of Canadian citizenship or Permanent Residency Status in Canada

### Things to know

- Applicants will not be considered for mature student admission if they meet regular status admission requirements, even if they are over the age of 19.
- International applicants must have the equivalent of a Manitoba High School Diploma and cannot apply as mature students.

Mature student admission is not guaranteed. The admission decision is based on your demonstrated academic potential, successful completion of the required prerequisite subjects and successful completion of any program specific entry requirements.
