

Imperial Award for Electrical or Millwright

Deadline: Friday, March 21, 2025, at 4 p.m.

Established by Imperial Oil in 2022, the Imperial Award for Electrical and Millwright supports post-secondary students who identify as female and/or are Indigenous and are enrolled full time in Electrical Applications or Millwright at MITT.

Number of awards: 1 award | Value: \$2,000

Eligibility Criteria: To be eligible for this award, applicants must

- 1. Complete this application form in full
- **2.** Be a current MITT post-secondary student
- 3. Domestic student (citizen or permanent resident)
- 4. Identify as female and/or Indigenous
- 5. Be currently enrolled in Electrical Application, or Industrial Mechanic/Millwright program

Application Steps

To be considered for this award, applicants must:

1. Email studentawards@mitt.ca with the following documents:

a. Personal Statement

Include a personal statement to include reasons for studying program at MITT, how scholarship would help future goals, as well as outlining any experience with volunteering or community leadership.

b. Letter of Reference

A letter of reference must be included in the application, preferably from a referee related to student's volunteer or community engagement.

Additional Notes

By submitting an application for the Imperial MITT Scholarship, the student acknowledges and agrees to the following terms:

- 1. The scholarship recipient consents to MITT sharing their contact information with Imperial Oil. The recipient may be contacted directly by the donor for scholarship promotion purposes. Additionally, Imperial Oil may request opportunities to meet with the student throughout the year, including discussions about potential employment.
- 2. The scholarship will be applied first to the recipient's MITT tuition account. If the account is fully paid, any remaining funds may be issued directly to the student. For students paying tuition in installments through Rotessa, the scholarship amount will be used to proportionally reduce the remaining installment payments.
